


Key Insights: One Voice Wales COST-OF-LIVING CRISIS SURVEY 2023/24

We surveyed all 732 Community & Town Councils in Wales to ask their views on how the Cost of Living Crisis is affecting their communities and how they are involved in any support being provided.

The research tells us our Communities are still struggling


- 43% of Households reported a worsening financial situation
- 23% said they would not be able to cope financially
- 20% of households were eating less food
- 44% said rising costs affecting mental health*
