Welsh Government Democratic Engagement Grant

The Army Benevolent Fund

The Army Benevolent Fund provides grants to charities and organisations that provide lifetime support to soldiers, veterans and their immediate families when they are in need. The funding is intended to support charities and organisations with projects and activities that directly benefit the Army community

Electricals Recycling Fund

The Electricals Recycling Fund supports recycling, reuse or repair organisations that test creative and practical methods for collecting unwanted electricals.

There is funding available for two types of projects:

Projects to grow existing collection methods for small electricals.

Projects to innovate new approaches to repairing, reusing and/or recycling electricals.
