GRANTS & FUNDING POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITIES

Rural Wales LPIP Community- led Research Programme Grant now open.

This is a new opportunity for up to six rural communities to get £20,000 to explore what matters locally that can lead to positive change.

The LPIP has four themes and your topic should align with at least one:

- Building a Regenerative Economy
- Supporting the Net Zero Transition
- Empowering Communities for Cultural Recovery
- Enhancing Wellbeing in Place

The grant is open to communities within rural Wales in a location or place from the following rural local authority areas in Wales:

Carmarthenshire, Ceredigion, Conwy, Denbighshire, Gwynedd, Isle of Anglesey, Monmouthshire, Pembrokeshire, Powys and Vale of Glamorgan.

Parkinsons UK

Grants of up to £3,000 are available to support physical activity projects for people with Parkinson's all over the UK.

National Lottery Awards for All offers funding from £300 to £20,000 to support what matters to people and communities; things that are important to them, including the impact of the cost of living crisis..
