

Pembrey & Burry Port Town Council Meals on Wheels Service



At a glance

Pembrey & Burry Port Town Council started an important initiative supporting vulnerable residents to access food during COVID-19.

It has continued to be a valuable resource for older people in the community with the council continuing to provide a hot meal delivery service twice a week.

Service users are provided with the menu in advance and wherever possible ensuring that recipients can choose meals that suit their preferences and dietary requirements.

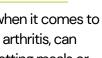

The Town Council employ a chef who has responsibility for the menu, ordering produce, preparing the food and ensuring all food hygiene requirements are adhered to.

Volunteers support the service and are responsible for delivering meals on time, offering a friendly presence, and checking on the well-being of recipients during each visit

Challenges



Older people living on their own often face several challenges when it comes to preparing meals. Physical limitations, such as mobility issues or arthritis, can make cooking difficult, while cognitive decline may lead to forgetting meals or struggling with meal preparation. Many seniors also face financial constraints, limiting their ability to afford fresh, nutritious food or ready-made meals.

Solutions



The Meals on Wheels service provides an effective solution to the challenges faced by older people living on their own. By delivering hot, nutritious meals directly to their homes, the service ensures that residents have access to healthy food without the need for cooking, grocery shopping, or transportation. This initiative not only addresses physical limitations and dietary needs but also reduces social isolation, offering a sense of connection and support. Meals on Wheels helps improve the overall well-being of older residents, ensuring they maintain a balanced diet and feel cared for within their community.

"Our volunteers have built strong relationships with many of the residents, offering support that extends beyond delivering meals," said Cllr Dee Hamilton. "From a friendly chat to assisting with small tasks, these interactions help ensure that the residents can maintain a level of independence in their own homes."

Funding & Powers

Pembrey & Burry Port Town Council charge the recipients £5.00 per meal and £1.00 per pudding towards the cost of providing the service; the remaining costs are funded by the Council precept.

Pembrey and Burry Port Town Council have run a successful community support initiative, Fruity Friday since 2020. Parents register their children so that every Friday during the summer holidays they can pick up a free bag of 4 different fresh fruits. Alongside the fruit they provide fruit themed activities and recipes. This benefits the health of children whilst supporting families that have food poverty and by using different and sometimes unusual fruit, the children learn to try new things. In 2025 they aim to work with local allotments to educate children on where their fruit comes from and how to grow their own. The council would also like to provide activities for the children for the duration of the collection time on some of the days.
