

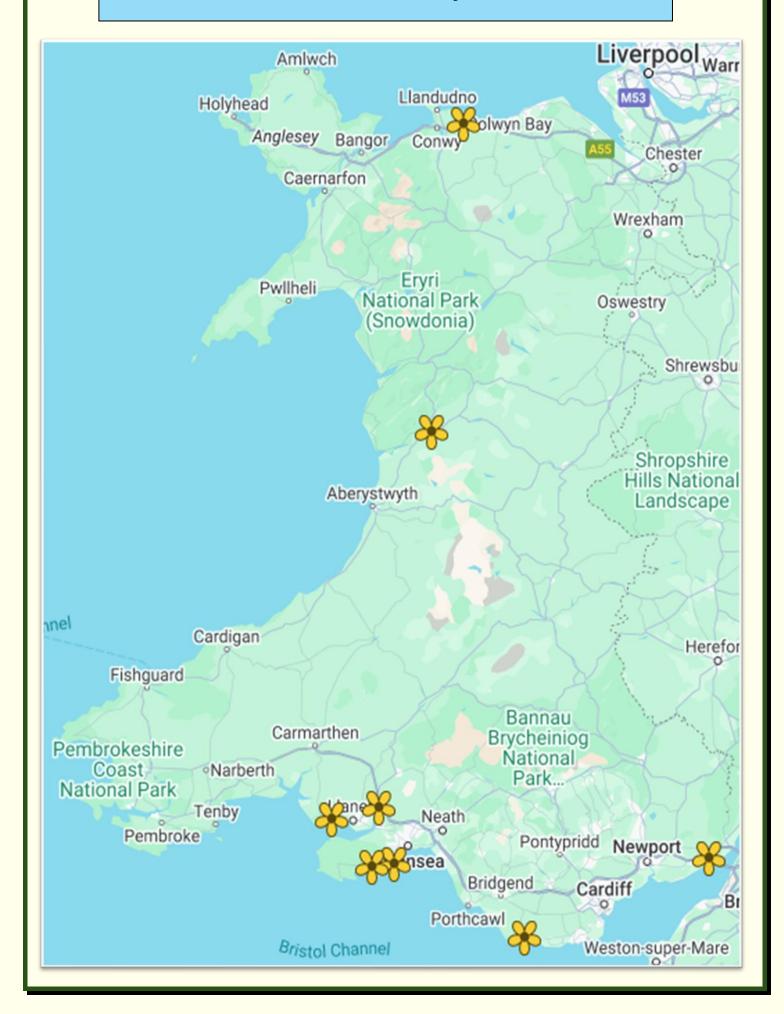

Jubilee Gardens: 4 Seasons Sensory Garden


A project to restore and enhance a small disused community space for nature with sensory spaces, seating, native plants, and Rain garden installations. Started: October 2024 Completed: March 2025





Mumbles, Swansea



The population is 16,600 and 12% are Welsh speakers. The Council has an annual precept of around £866,000


