About the National Day of Reflection

The National Day of Reflection is a moment to pause, remember, and acknowledge the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on communities across Wales and the UK.

It is also an opportunity to recognise the quiet, consistent work that helped communities through that time — particularly the efforts of community and town councils, clerks, councillors, and local volunteers who supported residents in countless practical and compassionate ways.

Optional ways to mark the day

Participation is entirely optional and there is no expectation to organise events or additional activities. Councils may choose one simple action, or none at all.

Where councils wish to mark the day, possible actions may include:

- A brief acknowledgement at a council meeting, including in the chair's opening remarks
- Observing a quiet moment of reflection at the March meeting
- Sharing a short message of thanks to clerks, councillors or volunteers
- Displaying a simple notice or message
- Including a brief mention in a newsletter or circular, where one is already planned
- Signposting residents to national or local remembrance activities

Small, proportionate gestures are entirely appropriate.
