Un Llais Cymru yw'r prif gorff aelodaeth ar gyfer y 731 Cyngor Tref a Chymuned ledled Cymru ac mae'n darparu cefnogaeth, cyngor a gwasanaethau hyfforddiant. Er 2021 mae Un Llais Cymru wedi hwyluso perthynas bwysig gyda rhaglen waith Lleoedd Lleol ar gyfer Natur ac mae wedi ymgynghori a chefnogi nifer o brosiectau cyfalaf mawr.

#### Trosolwg o'r Rhaglen Lleoedd Lleol ar gyfer Natur.

Mae Rhaglen Lleoedd Lleol ar gyfer Natur (LILIN) yn gynllun cyfalaf sy'n creu 'natur ar eich trothwy'. Mae prosiectau sy'n cael eu hariannu o dan y rhaglen hon yn canolbwyntio ar gasgliad o dargedau bioamrywiaeth e.e. newid arferion torri gwair, denu mwy o beillwyr, plannu coed a chreu llecynnau tyfu cymunedol. Un o albynnau allweddol unrhyw broiect yw bod rhaid creu, gwella neu adfer bioamrywiaeth.

Mae'r rhaglen yn cydnabod fod prosiectau sy'n gweithio gyda chymunedau difreintiedig mewn ardaloedd amddifadedd trefol/lled-drefol yn ychwanegu gwerth sylweddol. Mae dros 300 Cyngor Tref a Chymuned wedi chwarae rhan lwyddiannus yn y rhaglen dros y 5 mlynedd diwethaf. Er mwyn parhau a datblygu'r rhaglen lwyddiannus hon mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn parhau i fuddsoddi er mwyn creu mwy o leoedd lleol ar gyfer natur yn ystod 2025-2027.

Rhwng 2020 a 2025 darparwyd arian a chefnogaeth trwy brosiectau Partneriaethau Natur Lleol (PNLI), pecynnau Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus a grantiau cyfalaf trwy Gronfa Dreftadaeth y Loteri Genedlaethol. Trwy adeiladu ar yr ymgysylltu llwyddiannus gan y sector yn y flwyddyn gyntaf, daeth Un Llais Cymru yn aelod gwerthfawr o'r tîm rheolwyr rhaglenni yn 2021 trwy greu swydd Swyddog LILIN Un Llais Cymru.

Er 2021 mae'r Swyddog LILIN wedi gweithio'n agos gyda'r LNPS, y Gronfa Dreftadaeth a Cadwch Gymru'n Daclus i gefnogi ceisiadau am arian ac mae wedi datblygu rhwydwaith o gefnogaeth a chyngor. Mae hyn wedi cynyddu'n sylweddol y gwaith a wneir ar yr agenda bioamrywiaeth a lefelau cydymffurfiaeth gyda dyletswydd Bioamrywiaeth a gwytnwch ecosystemau Adran 6.



### Overview of role

You will assist the Programme manager in delivering on the aims and objectives of the Welsh Government's Local Places for Nature programme (LPfN) across the Community & Town Council (C&TC) sector.

You will be working as part of a team, led by the Lead Biodiversity Officer who will also act as the Local Places for Nature programme manager, supported by an admin assistant. You will report directly to the Local Places for Nature Programme manager, and as a valued member of the One Voice Wales staff, be supported by the Chief Executive Officer and the rest of the staff.

As the North Wales Biodiversity officer, you will provide practical support, specialist advice and training to the sector on nature recovery and greening of the public estate and to assist them to effectively manage amenity land for biodiversity. You will act as an advocate of the sector and represent their needs and facilitate positive engagement between C&TCs and other organisations. You will assist the Lead Biodiversity Officer to support and advise on national strategies, policies and compliance with biodiversity related legislation and law. You will provide project planning consultation, and practical support, to facilitate Local Places for Nature projects. Provide a specialist advisory capacity that enables the delivery of effective local projects that deliver the maximum benefit for biodiversity.

This a home-based role but the programme of work will be primarily focused on the Northern Counties of Wales and as such frequent travel will be required with some occasional weekend and evening work.

## Supplementary information

### **Local Places for Nature Funding Programme at One Voice Wales**

One Voice Wales is the principal membership organisation for the 731 Community & Town Councils (C&TCs) across Wales and provides support, advice and training services. Since 2021 One Voice Wales has facilitated significant engagement with the Local Places for Nature programme of work and has consulted and supported numerous large capital projects.

#### **Overview of the Local Places for Nature Programme.**

The Local Places for Nature Programme (LPfN) is a capital scheme that creates 'nature on your doorstep'.

Projects funded under this programme focus on a set of biodiversity targets e.g. changing mowing practices, increasing pollinators, tree planting and creating community growing space. A key output of any project must be that biodiversity is created, enhanced or restored.

The programme recognises that projects working with disadvantaged communities in urban/peri-urban areas of deprivation add significant value. There is a strong focus on community engagement and providing volunteering opportunities in particular for communities with little or no access to nature.

The programme has been in place since 2020 and has delivered hundreds of projects across Wales through the 4 programme managers. Over 300 Community & Town Councils have been actively engaged with the programme over the last 5 years. To continue and develop this successful programme Welsh Government are continuing to invest to create more local places for nature during 2025-2027.

From 2020 to 2025 funding and support was through Local Nature Partnership (LNP) projects, Keep Wales Tidy (KWT) packages and capital grants through the National Lottery Heritage Fund. Building on the successful engagement from the sector in the first year, One Voice Wales became a valued member of the programme managers team in 2021 with the creation of the One Voice Wales LPFN Officer.

Since 2021 The LPFN Officer has worked closely with the LNPs, Heritage fund and KWT to support applications for funding and developed a network of support and advice. This has significantly increased engagement with the biodiversity agenda and compliance with the Section 6 Biodiversity and ecosystem resilience duty.



## Programme plan


- Support existing LPfN projects with their maintenance, development, and management plans.
- Deliver a pipeline of projects to the LPfN funding programme. Working with the funding administrator to inform and advise the sector on funding opportunities available.
- Provide support in the planning managing and delivery of LPfN funded projects
- Providing Habitat management plans for the C&TCs (to include grasslands and tree planting)
- Production of resources and upskilling of the sector.
- Promote actions that contribute to biodiversity and ecosystem resilience.
- Liaise with other programme managers effectively to deliver the aims of the programme.
- Represent and promote the C&TC sector on various forums and at events.
- Use social media and other means to create awareness and share good practice in biodiversity improvements.
- Develop case studies to share best practice in the sector.
- Supporting C&TCs to work with partners to protect land under their management.
- Supporting Councils on meeting their Section 6 duty and meeting the NRAP objectives
- Auditing land owned / managed by the sector.
- Providing more ‘on the ground’ assessments of C&TC land.
- Ground truthing previous assessments on C&TC land.
- Mapping the land and liaising with NRW/LAs (GIS)
- Produce an accurate record of the sector’s contribution to the biodiversity agenda.

## Grants programme

- Carry out consultations and site visits.
- Assist Councils with the planning and delivery of biodiversity improvements.
- Assess grant applications against a set criterion and ensure all projects align with the aims of the programme.
- Procure and supply capital items showing consideration of local procurement and local biodiversity needs. (locally native species)
- Assist Councils to plan projects along the aims of the programme.
- Supply the materials and assist in the implementation and delivery of the projects alongside volunteers.

You can use examples from your personal life, family, home, work or volunteering. Please keep your answers concise and relevant to the question.

For example:

- S** An area of species rich wildflowers has been mown by a contractor in error.
- T** To restore the wildflowers and prevent a repeat of this in the future.
- A** Arranged a meeting between the land manager and the contractor and ensured that the location was clearly identified on a plan, and the importance of the agreed management method was understood by all parties.
- R** The wildflower area recovered, signage was installed, and the correct management schedule was adhered to, resulting in an increased species diversity on the site.
